And we decided to call this urgent conference CHOSEN because every child is a wanted child ... every child is precious in the eyes of our Lord ... every child is a child of God.


We are so very grateful that you are here today to partner with us as we seek to engage the Church in this critical mission. Thank you for helping bring hope to children who desperately need a "forever family."

JUSTIN MYERS - SHOW HOPE Justin Myers serves as the director of programs at Show Hope. He has a master of divinity in missions and a master's in business administration, which he has used in nonprofit and church settings over the past 10 years. He and his wife are parents of two children through adoption.
