Extend Your mercy to protect us from such disasters. Balance the rains, calm the storms and winds, lift the heat... (Psalm 57:1) Continue with personal prayer....

Put that hedge of protection around our cities, schools and workplaces. Surround us like the mountains surround Jerusalem. You alone are our Strength and Shield! Our hearts ache over too many shootings, too much violence and evil. Please help us. (Psalm 125:2; 28:7) Continue with personal prayer....

No matter what they face, help them to remember that You are the God of the impossible for those who live in faith and obedience. (Philippians 4:6-7; Matthew 19:26) Continue with personal prayer....

One day You will separate Your own from those who have not made You the Lord of their lives—their King. Please revive us again. May people repent of their sins and turn to You, so that their sins may be wiped away and a time of refreshing will come. (Psalm 85:6; Acts 3:19-20) Continue with personal prayer....
